



The following items are included in your package. If you find anything missing, contact your system administrator.




Note: The PSTN box CPN10 is used to connect CP860 conference phones to the PSTN (Public Switched Telephone Network). The PSTN box CPN10 should be purchased separately. For more information, refer to Yealink PSTN Box CPN10 Quick Start Guide.

Assembling the Phone


1. Connect the network and power, as shown below:

You have two options for network and power connections. Your system administrator will advise you which one to use.




Note: The IP phone should be used with Yealink original power adapter (5V/2A) only. If inline power (PoE) is provided, you don't need to connect the power adapter. Make sure the hub/switch is PoE-compliant.

2. Connect the optional USB flash drive, as shown below:




Note: The USB port can also be used to connect the expansion PSTN box CPN10.

3. Connect the optional expansion microphone, as shown below:



Note: Up to two expansion microphones can be connected to an IP conference phone.

4. Connect the optional PC or mobile device, as shown below:




Startup

After the IP phone is connected to the network and supplied with power, it automatically begins the initialization process. When the IP phone is first powered on, it goes to the setup wizard screen after startup. The setup wizard guides you to configure some basic features via phone user interface. After you complete the setup wizard, the phone is ready for use. You can configure the phone via phone user interface or web user interface.

Configuring Your Phone

Configuring via web user interface

Accessing the web user interface:

- 1. Press the **OK** key when the phone is idle to obtain the IP address of the phone.
- 2. Open the web browser on your computer, enter the IP address into the address bar (e.g., "http://192.168.0.10" or "192.168.0.10") and press Enter.
- 3. Enter the user name (default: admin) and password (default: admin) in the login page and click Confirm.

Account Settings: Click on Account->Register

Parameters of the SIP/Yealink Cloud account:

Register Status: It shows the register status of the current account.

Line Active: You can select Enabled/Disabled to enable/disable the account.

Label: It is shown on the LCD screen to identify the account.

It is shown as Caller ID when placing a call. Display Name:

Register Name: It is an authenticated ID for authentication provided by ITSP (required).

User Name: It is provided by ITSP for registration (required). Password: It is provided by ITSP for registration (required). Server Host: It is provided by ITSP for registration (required).

Parameters of the PSTN account:

Register Status: It shows the register status of the current account.

Line Active: You can select Enabled/Disabled to enable/disable the account.

Label: It is shown on the LCD screen to identify the account.

Register status icons on the LCD screen:

Note: Check with your system administrator if any error appears during the registration process or if a specific configuration is required for your registration.

Configuring via phone user interface

Account Settings:

Press the **Menu** soft key when the phone is idle, select **Settings->Advanced Settings** (default password: admin) ->**Accounts** to configure the account.

Note: For more information on account parameters, refer to Configuring via web user interface above.

Basic Call Features

Placing a Call

Do one of the following:

- Press .

Enter the number, and then press (), (ok), #== or the **Send** soft key.

- Enter the number.

Press (κ) , (κ) , (π) , or the **Send** soft key.

Answering a Call

Press (ok), or the **Answer** soft key.

Note: You can reject an incoming call by pressing the Reject soft key or on-hook key.

Ending a Call

Press or the **EndCall** soft key.

Redial

- Press to enter the **Placed Calls** list, press or to select the desired entry, and then press or the **Send** soft key.
- Press c twice when the phone is idle to dial out the last dialed number.

Call Mute and Un-mute

- Press 🐐 to mute the microphone during a call.
- Press again to un-mute the call.

Call Hold and Resume

To place a call on hold:

Press the **Hold** soft key during an active call.

To resume the call, do one of the following:

- If there is only one call on hold, press the **Resume** soft key.
- If there is more than one call on hold, press or to select the desired held call, and then press the **Resume** soft key.

Local Conference

CP860 can host up to five-way conference call with other parties.

To create a three-way local conference:

- 1. Press the **Conf** soft key during an active call. The call is placed on hold.
- 2. Enter the number of the second party, and then press the **Send** soft key.
- 3. Press the **Conf** soft key again when the second party answers.

To join more parties in an established conference call:

- 1. Press the **Conf** soft key after the conference call is established.
- 2. Enter the number of the new party, and then press , (ox), #wo or the **Send** soft key.
- 3. Press the **Conf** soft key when the party answers.

4. Repeat steps 1 to 3 to join more parties in the established conference call.

During the conference call, you can do the following:

- Press the **Hold** soft key to place the conference on hold.
- Press the **Conf** soft key to join more parties in an established conference call.
- Press the **Manage** soft key, and then press or to select the desired party:
 - Press the FarMute soft key to forbid the selected party from speaking. The muted party can hear
 everyone, but no one can hear the muted party.
 - Press the **Remove** soft key to remove the selected party from the conference call.
 - Press the **All Split** soft key to split the conference call into individual calls on hold.
 - Press the Back soft key to return to the previous screen.
- Press [*] to mute the conference call.
- Press or the EndCall soft key to drop the conference call.

Note: To set up a conference for one PSTN account, you need to activate a hook flash. For more specific information, refer to Yealink CP860 User Guide.

Call Recording

You can insert a USB flash drive into the USB port on your phone to record active calls and conferences. But this feature is not available by default. When connecting the PSTN box CPN10, you need to connect the USB flash drive to the USB port on the PSTN box CPN10 in advance.

Note: It is necessary to know about the rules and restrictions of any governing call-recording in the place where you are.

It is also very important to have the consent of the person you are calling before recording the conversation. The recorded files will be stored on your USB flash drive.

To record a call:

1. Press the **More** soft key, and then press the **Start REC** soft key during a call.

To stop recording:

1. Press the **More** soft key, and then press the **Stop REC** soft key.

Recorded Calls Playback

You can play back recorded calls on your phone through the phone's speaker.

To browse the recorded files:

- 1. Press Menu->USB Record->Browse Audio.
- 2. Press or to scroll through the recorded files.

To play back a recording:

- 1. Press Menu->USB Record->Browse Audio.
- 2. Press or to highlight the recording you want to play back.
- 3. Press the Play soft key.

During the recording playback, you can do the following:

- To pause the playback, press the **Pause** soft key.
 - You can press the **Play** soft key to continue the playback.
- To skip forward the playback, press **>>** . Press once to skip forward 8 seconds.
- To rewind the playback, press ◀ . Press once to rewind 8 seconds.
- To stop the playback, press the **Back** soft key.

Customizing Your Phone

Call History

- 1. Press the **History** soft key when the phone is idle.
- 2. Select the desired call history list and press the **Enter** soft key.
- 3. Press or to select an entry from the list, you can do the following:
 - Press the **Send** soft key to call the entry.
 - Press the **Delete** soft key to delete the entry from the list.

If you press the **Option** soft key, you can also do the following:

- Select **Detail** to view detailed information about the entry.
- Select **Add to Contact** to add the entry to the local directory.
- Select Add to Blacklist to add the entry to the blacklist.
- Select **Delete All** to delete all entries from the list.

Contact Directory

To add a contact:

- 1. Press the **Directory** soft key when the phone is idle, and then select **All Contacts**.
- 2. Press the Add soft key to add a contact.
- 3. Enter a unique contact name in the Name field and contact numbers in the corresponding fields.
- 4. Select the desired ring tone from the Ring field.
- 5. Press the Add soft key to accept the change.

To edit a contact:

- 1. Press the Directory soft key when the phone is idle, and then select All Contacts.
- 2. Press or to select the desired contact, press the **Option** soft key and then select **Detail**.
- 3. Edit the contact information.
- 4. Press the **Save** soft key to accept the change.

To delete a contact:

- 1. Press the **Directory** soft key when the phone is idle, and then select **All Contacts**.
- 2. Press or to select the desired contact, press the **Option** soft key and then select **Delete**.
- 3. Press the **OK** soft key when the LCD screen prompts "Delete selected item?".

Note: You can add contacts from call history easily. For more information, refer to Call History above.

Volume Adjustment

- Press + during a call to adjust the receiver volume of the speaker.
- Press + when the phone is idle or ringing to adjust the ringer volume.
- Press + to adjust the media volume in the corresponding screen.

Ring Tones

- Press the Menu soft key when the phone is idle, and then select Settings->Basic Settings->Sound-> Ring Tones->Common.
- 2. Press or to select **Common** or the desired account and then press the **Enter** soft key.
- 3. Press or to select the desired ring tone.
- 4. Press the **Save** soft key to accept the change.
